



€60M WAR ON GLOBAL WARMING

EX-Taoiseach Albert Reynolds has helped raise more than €60million in funding for measures to reduce **global warming** in Africa.

The Reynolds African Initiative will design and build technology systems to convert landfill-bound waste into renewable electricity in countries such as South Africa, Botswana and the Ivory Coast.

Mr Reynolds, inset, who was Taoiseach from 1992-1994, said: "The fight to reduce **global warming** will provide a cleaner tomorrow."

The €60million in public and private cash raised by Mr Reynolds will go to Global Environmental Energy Corp to

deliver the biosphere systems.

Municipal and **agricultural** waste, which would normally go directly to landfill sites, will be used to generate renewable electricity.

Biosphere systems also provide clean drinking water which is essential to health care in African communities.

GEECF is already operating the technology in Vietnam, Thailand and China.

Last week Mr Reynolds received an award from Belfast-based Flax Trust charity for his work on the Northern Ireland peace process.
